#### **Transporting Bedford 2020**

On Thursday 5th July, Jon Shortland, Chief Officer for Planning and Highways at Bedford Borough Council attended the Brickhill Parish Council meeting to update councillors. Transporting



Bedford 2020 has secured a total funding package of over £18m. It has three distinct themes within a package of measures aimed at solving some of the worst congestion problems namely pinch point schemes to reduce congestion at key locations, technology improvements in traffic signal control and capability and improvements focusing on the High Street and St Pauls Square. In the Summer of 2018, work starts on site for the first of the pinch point schemes in the Manton Lane area with main junction improvements taking place early next year.

The plans include:

Signalisation of Clapham Road/ Manton Lane/ Shakespeare

#### Road

- Enhancement to the operation of the Paula Radcliffe Way/Great Ouse Way roundabout
- Enhancement to the operation of the Manton Lane/Brickhill Drive junction
- Reviewing entrance arrangements at the Bedford Modern School
- Refurbishing the signals at Manton Lane / Brickhill Drive junction

## Brickhill Borough Councillors Update July 2018 From Wendy Rider and Charles Royden

Thank you to those people who have responded so positively to us as we have visited homes across Brickhill over the past few months. We are trying to get around as many as possible of 4,000 homes in Brickhill which we represent as councillors . If we don't manage to meet you then please

One of the issues which is continually raised on the doorstep relates to the continuing poor service received from Stagecoach with the Number 6 bus. Commuters report long waits and inaccurate timetable reports on the Real Time Information Systems. This is completely unacceptable and we will continue to make strong representations to senior management until this is resolved..

Residents are concerned about the severity and size of the new speed humps on Tyne Crescent. We complained about the poor quality of the resurfacing and the contractor agreed with us that some of the work was not of an acceptable quality. We did not want premature failure of the road surface and subsequently the contractor carried out the resurfacing at no cost to the council. However the speed humps were clearly enlarged and this is causing an unacceptable hazard for some residents who have reported to us that their vehicles made contact with the humps at low speeds. We are working with the council to have the contractor reduce these speed humps to a less intrusive height.

We are pleased that our request for resurfacing of the car park at Avon Drive shops was carried out quickly once the surface broke up after the severe winter weather. This is now looking much better and encourages people to shop locally. Over the summer we are also monitoring the cutting of the grass to make sure it is of a high standard. If you have any areas of concern then please let us know as occasionally areas can be missed as happened in Mallard Hill recently. It is important that we constantly take a pride in this parish of Brickhill for the benefit of all who live here and as your councillors we will work hard to make this a great place to live

After a splendid blossom display, the community orchard seems to be gearing up for a bumper harvest later in the year. 


