Organised by Brickhill Parish Council it marked the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War. After a reading of 'Tribute to the Millions', the Last Post was played, followed by two minutes silence then Reveille. Finally the 'Beacon of Light' was lit, to symbolise an end to the darkness of war and a return to the light of peace.

## Brickhill Borough Councillors Update November 2018 From Wendy Rider and Charles Royden



There has never been a time in Brickhill when we have experienced such violence on our streets with murders and stabbings taking place. We were pleased that so many people came to the public open meeting at St Mark's to listen to the Assistance Chief Constable Sebire explain what was going on. The National Crime Agency has used the term 'County Lines' to refer to gangs dealing drugs across the country and exploiting children and young adults in the process. Bedford like many other places has seen an extraordinary rise in children and young people involved in gangs with drugs, knife crime and most recently in Brickhill a shooting. The police were eager to point out that with this type of crime there is no general increased risk to residents. Of course it is really important for parents to be aware of the dangers if their children become involved in these gangs and we would encourage you to be vigilant and seek help if you have concerns.

Residents attending the public meeting called on the police for more visible community policing in Brickhill. The police were extremely honest in saying that they cannot provide the level of policing which is required and at times it was like playing 'Whackamole'. Furthermore ACC Sebire warned that she has to make a further £4.7m worth of cuts to her force next year. It is a fact that if we continue to make cuts to the services which provide the foundations to our community, such as education, police, council and social services, then it is inevitable that cracks will appear. This breakdown in society combined with some extreme levels of poverty provides an environment in which vulnerable young adults can become exploited and harmed. Whilst a long-term partnership approach is needed to adequately address the current problems, we need an immediate reversal of the current funding cuts for our police, especially in Bedfordshire which already gets a poor deal in the government funding formula.

As your local councillors we will continue to work hard and keep you informed through regular deliveries of FOCUS, surgeries and our website. 

## Some News from the Latest Parish Council Meeting and the Allotments and Open Spaces Meeting



**Woodlands Park Team :** The parish council has received confirmation that Woodlands Park is included in the local policing arrangements for Brickhill.

**Brickhill Community Centre:** The parish council has accepted a quotation from Allan Peacock Street Lighting Ltd to improve the lighting to the car park. This will involve the installation of two lighting columns close to the entrance to the car park. The existing wall lighting will remain.

**Additional Parking in Rooksmead:** The parish council is well aware of the difficulties of parking in this area with vehicles frequently resorting to parking on the grass adjacent to the pond. The parish council has agreed to fund up to a maximum of £10,000 towards the costs of the installation of a grasscrete area. The total cost of the project is estimated to be approximately £20,000.

**CCTV:** The parish council is investigating the cost of purchasing a mobile CCTV camera which would be linked to and monitored by the CCTV Control Centre at Bedford Borough Council.

**Waveney Green:** Having finally obtained the lease for the remaining strip of Waveney Green near Francis Groves Close, the parish council are now seeking permission from Bedford Borough Council to install a footpath to join Francis Groves Close to the existing footpaths on Waveney Green. A quotation from Phoenix Surfacing has already been accepted by the parish council. They will also be undertaking some footpath repairs on the section of path near to the play areas.

## News from Scott Primary...

This term Year 6 at Scott Primary School have been learning all about Crime and Punishment through the ages. We started with medieval ordeals of fire and water and are working all of the way up to modern day policing and forensic science.

As part of our curriculum enrichment we went on a trip to the Tower of London. After a very exciting train ride to London Bridge, we took a short walk to the Tower of London. We were very lucky to see them laying out special lanterns all around the Tower to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War. Did you know that 11 spies were executed at the Tower? We had time to explore the Crown Jewels (our favourite was Queen Victoria's crown), the Torture Tower (where we learnt about the manacles, rack and the scavenger's daughter) and the Bloody Tower, renamed after two princes who mysteriously vanished there and are thought to have been murdered! After lunch we then had a special talk from an Elizabethan Gaoler (or someone pretending to be one anyway!). He told us about how the prisons at the Tower of London were actually very nice as they only kept important and rich people or royalty. We then learnt about famous people who had been prisoners or executed at the Tower such as Anne Boleyn, Guy Fawkes and Lady Jane Grey. Here we are with the Keeper of the Tower of London, made out of all sorts of Armour and weapons to show off Britain's might!

We had a fabulous day and are looking forward to continuing our learning journey with this fascinating topic!



## News from Waveney Green.....

In the last newsletter, the parish council reported that the galleon is sadly starting to look its age and you were asked to suggest alternative equipment. A range of equipment was suggested including simply replacing the galleon with a new version. A number of you asked for a piece of equipment which was suitable for access by disabled children. The parish council was keen to ensure that whatever equipment was chosen would be



accessible to all. Of all the suggestions, the most popular was for a roundabout similar to the one pictured. This has gates which open allowing access for wheelchairs and buggies.



The Clerk will now contact play equipment suppliers over the coming weeks with the aim of getting something installed in the Spring of 2019.

## Police News.....

### Tackling youth violence: news from Sgt Luck Blackburn

Bedfordshire Police has set up a brand new, dedicated team, to tackle serious gang youth violence in North Bedfordshire. This follows concerns raised by residents in Bedford and



Kempston. The team is called 'Op Arora' and is made up of six officers, who provide a proactive response to reports of serious youth violence. They receive daily intelligence and information about incidents linked to the top four gangs in Bedford borough, and their activity. They then patrol hotspot areas, and over the past eight weeks have had a number of successes including: 21 arrests, 8 school engagements with local high schools, 147 Intelligence submissions, 68 Stop and Searches, 1 Criminal Behaviour Order obtained at court and 5 more being reviewed, 2 full community protection notices issued with 9 Community Protection Notice Warnings issued to gang members. The team has been extended until mid-December, and I'm sure will continue to have a significant impact until then.

We remain committed to working with partners, and a joined up approach to tackling serious youth violence is vital. Like knife crime, tackling serious youth violence will require a long-term approach and we'll only be able to do this with support from local authorities, schools and the community. To that end, the team work closely to safeguard the most vulnerable individuals linked to gangs and youth violence, focusing on education, diversionary tactics and engagement to fully understand the issues and work together to break the cycle.

### Bedfordshire Police and Neighbourhood Watch

Following the recent murders in Brickhill and also a series of other crimes, the local Neighbourhood Policing Team came to Woodlands Park on 10th November. Officers knocked on many doors in the area, while residents were able to visit the mobile Police Station to find out more about Neighbourhood Watch and talk with officers about crime prevention and other issues.

There are Neighbourhood Watch groups in many parts of Brickhill, but there are some gaps. ### Police priority setting meeting

The Bedfordshire Police team that covers Brickhill, De Parys and Harpur has a meeting four times a year to agree what should be the main priority for each area. The next meeting is at Bedford School, De Parys Avenue, on Tuesday 4th December, from 7:30pm to 9pm. The current agreed priority for Brickhill is drugs, which is the root cause of much of the violence that has taken place recently. When the exact location of the meeting is known, we will share it on social media. All residents are welcome to attend the meeting.

The Community Centre is leased by Brickhill Parish Council who are responsible for the structure of the building. But it is the Brickhill Community Association, a charity, which is responsible for the day-to-day running of the Centre as well as bookings.



The Centre consists of two halls – one large and a smaller hall on the first floor. Both halls have associated facilities for making drinks and snacks and for washing up. All parts of the Community Centre can be accessed by physically disabled people as there is a lift to the first floor.

There are gents and ladies toilets on both the ground and first floors; there is also a disabled toilet on the ground floor. There is also a small meeting room on the ground floor, with doors that lead to a paved outdoor area.

The car park has space for 20 vehicles, with additional parking space available at the nearby Avon Drive shopping parade and along Avon Drive.


