
Waveney Green: We have been experiencing broken bottles on the children's play equipment. Please be vigilant and let the Clerk know if you see any such behaviour.

Brickhill Borough Councillors July 2019 From Cllr Wendy Rider and Cllr Charles Royden

There is a lot of discussion about roadworks across the Borough at the moment. Disruption was caused when Highways England closed access to the bypass at Great Barford and traffic ended up going across town.



This was then followed by the closure of Bromham Railway Bridge by Network Rail to allow electrification of the railway going north from Bedford. Incidentally despite the disruption we are suffering, the Government has decided that Bedford will have a downgraded rail service under the next East Midlands franchise, with no more intercity trains. We will continue to fight this decision.

Work will now progress on a number of schemes which we have planned in Bedford as part of Transporting Bedford 2020, a £20 million scheme to help tackle congestion. This represents the largest ever road investment in our town centre and it cannot be put on hold for year while Network Rail remove the bridge or we would lose much of the money for which we have worked so hard to raise. Work will therefore go on but some schemes such as Manton Lane and the new junctions at Sainsburys and the Clapham Bypass will have to be delayed until Network Rail have finished. However work will start on the High Street next year after the River Festival and this will see completely new stone pavements and traffic reduced to one lane with average speed cameras. Our High Street will look superb! Junctions at Cow Bridge, Britannia Road and Shakespeare Road are all to be tackled and in Brickhill there will be new traffic lights on Kimbolton Road at the junctions with Putnoe Lane, Brickhill Drive and Polhill Avenue. Please be patient as all of this will improve traffic and help build a more attractive and prosperous town.

Brickhill walks and footpath activities

On a glorious evening of the longest day a group of walkers, including a number of Brickhill and Woodlands Park residents, met at The Pheasant PH and enjoyed a drink and a social before setting off through Brickhill Country Park to watch the sun go down on the ridge. It turned out to be one of the best sunsets for weeks and everyone enjoyed the evening. There is still time to enjoy an evening walk on Thursday 22nd August 7-00pm from Mowsbury Park, Kimbolton Road car park. It will last 90 minutes approx 4-5 miles, everyone is welcome, just turn up a few



minutes before the start and if dry, trainers or good comfortable shoes are ideal. There is usually a break during the walk so bring a drink or snack. September follows and the 10th annual Bedfordshire Walking Festival takes place between 7th and 15th. During the nine days there are some 16 walks in and around Bedford and on Sunday 8th a tent will be set up in Priory Country park from where two walks will take place and information can be obtained about walking opportunities, groups, the path network and our footpath working group. News from Scott Primary...

All 450 children at Scott Primary took part in a range of exciting activities, organised by our own specialist PE teacher, during their Healthy Schools Week. The activities included rock climbing, golf, an assault course, tennis, a healthy eating workshop led by Waitrose and a smoothie bike. During the week, children were given the opportunity to participate in activities that they wouldn't normally have access to and to challenge themselves to try new experiences. Our recent OFSTED inspection recognised that "Pupils understand the importance of physical fitness and healthy lifestyles which has led to their active involvement in exercise along with promoting their





emotional and mental well being." The children learnt about the benefits of exercise and healthy eating choices and were involved in lots of experiments to measure the impact of exercise on their bodies. As always, our children behaved in an exemplary manner with many external coaches commenting on this. Mo, one of these external coaches said: "I have thoroughly enjoyed being with your pupils this week. Over my 15 years of teaching and working with other schools. I have met and observed many children and the various situations and behaviours that can present themselves. I have to say your school has some of the nicest, politest and kindest children I have ever met. They took on the challenge of a new activity really enthusiastically and willingly which was fantastic. They were also very willing to try things a few times to succeed – resilience! That's the sort of thing that really makes my day. " This was the most successful Healthy Schools Week so far and we look forward to planning even more exciting activities for next year.

News from Brickhill Primary...

The children at Brickhill Primary School have impressed us all again, in so many ways: The Year 3's performed brilliantly at the Corn Exchange in the annual Sing On; under the guidance of the talented Miss Pollicella, the children sang beautifully and confidently. The following night they were treated to a sleepover at the school where they enjoyed playing tennis, football and cricket amongst other things. Burgers and hotdogs filled their hungry tummies, and hot chocolate and popcorn settled them down for a good night's sleep.

The Year 6's have from a very enjoyable trip to Blue Peris, where they faced many challenges and overcame their fears. They worked as a team to climb mountains, explore gorges, swim in lakes and build strong-structured dens. A day at the beach proved to be not just pleasurable, as they battled against the waves to defeat a slippery cliff. It was a fantastic opportunity, which the Year 6 children fully embraced. While most of our eldest pupils were going on adventurous hikes, the few who stayed at school had an equally fun time. They also built fabulous dens, which were still standing after almost a week! They used some of their time to be outstanding helpers on Years R-4 sports day and to support learning in the lower years. They cooked mouth-watering brownies and made fruit and chocolate kebabs. An afternoon was spent designing and making catapults; paper boulders were flung a whopping 10m. A photography challenge taught the pupils how to take interesting, well-lit pictures, which they then displayed appropriately. We must soon say goodbye to our Year 6's; it will be an emotional day when they leave but we know that they are ready. Park Wood Local Nature Reserve

Amongst its many positive conservation features, the Reserve is a local hotspot for some of our terrestrial orchids. Each year we check the numbers and have seen that our three main species are doing well. The most frequent is the common spotted orchid (Dactylorhiza fuchsii – pictured) but we also have pyramidal (Anacamptis pyramidalis) and bee orchids (Ophrys apifera). They are still flowering but will soon be producing seed for next season's crop. Other high summer attractions for you include our wildflower meadow with its wide array of nectar producing plants attracting a myriad butterflies, our ponds and their dragonflies and, of course the burgeoning forthcoming fruit harvest in the community orchard. Cycling in Brickhill is encouraged but NOT on the pavement.....

Cycling offers mobility for everyone. It is a quick mode of transport for door to door short journeys and saves money on parking and fuel. It keeps you fit and healthy and helps reduce traffic congestion, air pollution and climate change. In Brickhill some 5 to 10% of residents already use a bicycle to cycle to work, school, railway station, shops, etc or simply for leisure. They are able to do this using Bedford's extensive cycle network of off-road paths and tracks, quiet roads and on-road cycle lanes along more busier roads. Yes there are still some gaps and some sections not so good as



others but it is possible to get to all locations in Brickhill and the whole of the town safely. There are more than 65 signalled cycle crossings of which Brickhill has four and three underpasses.

Please do not give cyclists a bad name by riding on pavements/footways by the side of roads unless they have been classified as dual use for cyclists and pedestrians. Unfortunately it is not just in Brickhill where pavement riding occurs with regular frequency but in the whole of Bedford and many other towns and cities. Most of Brickhill's residential roads are now 20mph zones which make them safer for vulnerable people including cyclists. Please use the roads instead of the adjacent pavement/footway. A plea to motorists - please consider the possible presence of cyclists and respect the speed limit and when overtaking always leave a minimum clearance of 1.5 metres. http://www.cyclebedford.org.uk/ contains lots of useful information including cycle maps, training etc. The full article as well as a Code of Conduct for cyclists and some useful websites and videos can be accessed on www.brickhillparishcouncil.gov.uk.
