

Report from your local community police ... Denying criminals use of the road

On the 4 September we held our quarterly community priority setting meeting for the Brickhill, De Parys and Harpur areas of Bedford. At these meetings we provide recent crime statistics (available on Police.co.uk), talk about what the team has been doing in these areas and decide on our future focus, while of course still managing many other things throughout Bedford. Previously for Brickhill and De Parys, drugs was the focus, as so many residents felt strongly that it was a problem. In the last period we also were aware of a rise in the perception of burglary. In the next period, I put forward an idea of "denying criminals use of the road" with the aim of tackling the use of vehicles by people engaging in criminal and unlawful activity such as not

Unlawful Encampments

This year has seen an unprecedented number of unlawful encampments in Brickhill, repeatedly these have been on the green on Brickhill Drive. As councillors we believe that local authorities should be granted powers



to confiscate vehicles which refuse to leave public land. Sadly the government has tied the hands of local councils and they are forced to take lengthy court procedures and play cat and mouse with multiple applications to the court for different groups of people on the same sites. Governments appear to consider the human rights of those who engage in this activity to be more important than those of the law abiding settled community. Our green has been left in a disgusting condition requiring cleansing to remove large amounts of litter, fly tipping and human waste. One recent encampment also coincided with a burglary in which large amounts of equipment were stolen from the scouts and the council.

We have sought to use legal means to prevent these encampments and since a High Court Injunction was placed on Waveney Green there has only been one brief episode and the encampment was quickly moved. However recent challenges have been made in the courts by travellers and the same court process now has to be engaged when encampments refuse to abide by the injunction, causing delays. We have also negotiated with the police to ask them to use their Section 61 powers which allow them to immediately remove encampments of six or more vehicles when they were located on public land. On some occasions the police have done this and we believe this is the best and fastest way to remove disorderly unlawful encampments. We will always ask the police to do so.

These encampments are a criminal disturbance to our community and there is a cost involved in dealing with them. The lengthy court process and the cleansing of the sites all involve large numbers of already stretched council staff. We are extremely grateful to council officers who always respond immediately as soon as we report an encampment and action is taken through the courts as quickly as possible.

Given the difficulties outlined above as soon as the last attack occurred on Brickhill Drive we asked council officers to begin excavating a shallow ditch. This measure has been helpful elsewhere as whilst it stops caravans it can be mown and does not obscure the open aspect of the green. It must be stressed that protective measures such as barrier posts, ditches and bunding are not entirely effective at preventing encampments. Access points must be provided for maintenance and emergency vehicles and those who engage in unlawful encampments have shown a willingness to break locks and gates to gain access. This has frequently occurred across the Borough, even on sites which also have High Court Injunctions. Nevertheless they are clearly a discouragement and together with CCTV we must do all we can to protect our community on sites which are frequently attacked. We will continue to pursue all legal means to reinforce the protection and allow the fastest removal of those who unlawfully access our community land. As soon as any unlawful encampment arrives in Brickhill we always keep you informed within minutes on our website www.puttingbrickhillfirst.com

Park Wood Local Nature Reserve

Summer comes to an end with its crescendo of fruits, berries and seeds. The apples in our community orchard have done particularly well as you can see from the laden Laxton Fortune (pictured). The hedgerows are weighed down with rose hips, blackberries, hawthorn haws, guelder rose and wayfaring tree berries. Our wildflower meadow has been mown and we have

removed the vegetation to encourage next year's flowers to grow strongly with as little

competition from coarse grasses as possible. At this time of year there are few nectar sources for our insects and so ragwort (pictured) is particularly useful. Ragwort has a regrettably poor reputation as it is somewhat toxic to grazing livestock, But as the reserve has no cattle, horses, sheep or goats (which, anyway, avoid it and will not eat it in the pasture), it is left as a late summer food supply for our welcome bees, beetles, hoverflies and butterflies.


One of the good things about living in Brickhill is that the verges and greens are regularly cut and everything looks clean and neat and this encourages residents and visitors not to throw litter and to take responsibility for their dog



poo. There is however one part of the parish which is let down by dog owners

and that is Clapham Park and the entrance off Hawk Drive. Please see the "before" photos on the left and above. The area around the entrance was overgrown and dog owners had been leaving "poo" bags and allowing their dogs to do their "doggy doos" on the

grass. Disgusting, unhygienic and a health hazard particularly as there are two schools and a dog poo bin nearby. Having heard that there had been complaints to Brickhill Parish Council, Barry Ingram very kindly volunteered and took action on its behalf and as a result the area has now been cleared of dog poo, litter and the vegetation cut back, as the photos below show. Everyone has a responsibility to do their bit to help make Brickhill a nice place to live and to







