Woodlands Park news – from Mark Fitzpatrick, Chair of Brickhill Parish Council
The delay in completing the adoption of the remainder of Woodlands Park is one of the biggest ongoing concerns for the parish council. We have received the following update from the Borough: "Bedford Borough Council have been working with Persimmon Homes and Taylor Wimpey to progress the adoption of the Country Park, playgrounds and open space areas within the Woodlands Development. We are now in the very final stages of the adoption process, with just one final legal document outstanding which the council is chasing. The Council therefore hopes to have the adoption finalised over the next few months, albeit we are putting the pressure on for this side of Christmas".

After another accident in Ashmead Road, near the junction with Bramley Way, the parish council is asking the borough to look at that section of road, to see what could be done to improve safety.

I am sorry to say that Chris Bailes has stood down as a parish councillor for Woodlands Park. He was diligent in chasing for progress, to get the outstanding issues ('snagging list') for the Woodlands Park estate resolved, as well as taking a key role in the process we followed to decide how the 'Ravensden money' should be spent, as well as the council's Planning Committee and more besides. Michael Jarman-Webb continues as the other parish councillor for Woodlands Park and the vacancy should be filled in early 2020.



Winter Cycling in Brickhill and Elsewhere

Darker nights are now with us. To be safe as a cyclist it is important for you and your bicycle to



be seen. Wear bright or fluorescent clothing. Children should wear cycle helmets although it is a personal choice for adults. Although your bicycle should be maintained properly all year round please ensure particularly during the winter months that:

- Both tyres are in good condition. Worn tyres are more prone to punctures and slipping on greasy roads.
- Brake blocks are not worn down. Modern brake blocks and rims in wet weather will wear out faster. Please check brakes each time

before setting out.

- As there is more dirt on the road during the winter and also salt both chain and gear shifts should be kept regularly oiled to prevent rusting.
- Both front and rear lights are working. Two rear lights, one flashing, are useful in case one goes out while cycling. You may be able to see the motorist, but will they be able to see you? (see the video 'See and be Seen'

Park Wood Local Nature Reserve..... The season of change

Autumn brings dramatic changes in the Reserve. The warm, wet conditions are to the liking of our fungi which throw up spore-producing fruiting bodies in great abundance at this time. Our soils will require many decades of recuperation and nourishment before they become fully mature woodland soils with their own populations of symbiotic mycorrhizal fungi, so essential for the well-being of our trees. For the time being we have good populations of saprophytic fungi (those that break down dead organic matter) such as the brittlestems (*Psathyrella* spp. – pictured).



The influx of winter thrushes became apparent in the middle of October, with flocks of redwings



(*Turdus iliacus*) feeding on the Reserve's berries. They arrive from the colder climes of Scandinavia, Iceland and Russia. Fieldfares (*T. pilaris* – pictured) join them and will also feast on the orchard windfalls. You may also notice many more blackbirds than were apparent in the summer, as continental birds join our residents.

Brambling (*Fringilla montifringilla*), another winter visitor, is a close relative of the chaffinch. Particularly large influxes occur when it is a poor year for beech mast on the continent. These birds will remain with us for the winter and by early spring the males will be looking particularly handsome with their jet black heads.

Brickhill Lower School Football Club provides a great local opportunity for youngers to get exercise and enjoy and develop their football skills as well as develop great life skills through working as a team. But to keep going it needs adults to give up their time. We are looking for a **new Chairperson and Club Secretary**. By July



2020 I will have served as Chairman for three years and as my son moves on to the next age group it is time for me to step aside for a new Club Chairperson and Club Secretary to join the club and take it forward into the future. Without these volunteers there is *real risk that the club will fold at the end of this year*. 


