Bedford Borough Council Local Plan 2035

Planning is a dry topic, but this Local Plan will affect our area for ever. It covers a variety of topics, but most significantly it looks at what development should take place in the Borough between 2021 and 2035, including sites for housing, retail and employment. It also includes the process for deciding what areas should be kept as green space.

Developers and landowners were asked to suggest sites which could be developed. The only site directly within Brickhill is the agricultural field at the very north of the parish, which has been proposed to be included within the suggested new large village centered on the old RAE Wind Tunnel site. However there are also other sites very close to Brickhill, which would either overlook existing neighbourhoods (such as the 500 home proposal for Graze Hill, directly across the brook from Woodlands Park) or affect traffic through Brickhill (such as other proposed sites in Ravensden, which would increase traffic on Brickhill's roads).

Brickhill Parish Council will be discussing its response to the consultation on the Local Plan at its meeting on 1st June. We have invited a representative of the developer of the Wind Tunnel Site to address the meeting and answer questions. Please do come along.

Brickhill Bus Service Enhancement

Grant Palmer, the family owned local bus operator, has shown faith in the residents of Brickhill by enhancing its route No 21 to hourly during the daytime from Woodlands Park to the town centre via Larkway and Kimbolton Road (convenient for the North Wing Hospital).

From 2nd May 2017 there has been a doubling of services from 4/5 to 8 times per day on Mondays to Fridays and 9 times on Saturdays excluding Bank Holidays. This gives, with the existing services No 20 (3x) to the railway station, No 22 (x1) to the town centre via Larkway, Brickhill Drive and Roff Avenue (continuing to Sainsbury's Clapham Road on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays) and No 28 (x1) via Woodlands Park roundabout, a total of 13 services on Mondays to Fridays and 10 on Saturdays. The change also enhances the eastern side of Brickhill, the 'Larkway area' which already has the regular parallel Kimbolton Road service No 28 and in the south east, the Stagecoach No 7 and No 10. Please use these services to ensure that they continue and help reduce the town's congestion and pollution problems.


Neighbourhood Development Plan




