

Tackling speeding traffic in Brickhill Drive

Over the years there have been many accidents and near-misses in Brickhill Drive. There have been injuries and one fatality. The speed of traffic is a significant underlying cause and there have been requests from residents to deal with this. Brickhill Parish Council got the speed warning sign installed at the top of Brickhill Drive, but this is just a reminder to drivers. Installing speed cameras that would result in speeding drivers getting fined could help, but given the length of Brickhill Drive several cameras would be needed to be effective. Elsewhere in the Borough there are now some Average Speed Cameras which can help enforce reduced traffic speeds throughout a lengthy section of road. Brickhill Parish Council are considering the installation of Average Speed Cameras on Brickhill Drive, but we want to know residents views. The Community Safety Forum is to consult specifically with residents of Brickhill Drive, but all Brickhill residents can use the form below to give their views:

Next year's Year 7, will be involved in an exciting partnership with the University of Bedfordshire; the project is called 'Opening Doors'. The aim of the project is to improve careers and skills awareness and begin looking at employability; it will also cover parts of the new Citizenship curriculum.

As councillors we become involved in a variety of matters including schools, planning issues, local crime and housing. However the single biggest issue which residents contact us about every month is roads. The problems are generally speeding or inconsiderate and unlawful



parking at junctions and on verges. There is a lot going on to help tackle this at the moment including consideration of yellow lines at problem junctions and introducing a new 20mph limit on roads around Curlew Crescent. These 20mph zones have proved to be effective at reducing speed, albeit over time, as attitudes change. Lowering speed just by a few miles per hour has a dramatic impact upon reducing deaths and casualties. We are also now considering the possibility of average speed cameras on Brickhill Drive, which has seen a lot of serious and fatal accidents over previous years. These cameras could also be considered for other Brickhill roads in future years, so please let us have your views.

One road which we are delighted to report progress on is the bypass. Intense negotiations have taken place, resulting in all land owners finally agreeing to drop their opposition. The work is out to tender with completion expected in 2016. This will cut journey times and congestion for Brickhill residents who will be able to avoid travelling down Shakespeare Road and instead join the bypass at the junction by Sainsburys.
