Brickhill Borough Councillors Report

On Wednesday 22 October we were pleased to join Mayor Dave Hodgson and Anita Barker the Headteacher of Scott Lower School as Mayor Dave officially opened two brand new classrooms. It was a great day to see the new 'state of the art' classrooms providing superb places for children to learn. The staff, governors and children are to be congratulated for the continued success of this brilliant school.



On Friday 24 October we saw the historic sod cutting event to mark the start of work on the £18 million Northern Section of the Bedford Western Bypass. It has taken a huge effort involving compulsory purchase orders and a series of negotiations by the Mayor to unblock the logjam. Overcoming these obstacles brings to an end a 50 year wait and work has started on the new road which will bring new investment and jobs to Bedford Borough, while making it easier for all road users to get around.

Closer to home we are delighted that work will soon start on upgrading and resurfacing Avon Drive shops. The car park area especially has required repair for some time and we are delighted to have been able to allocate funds to enable this work to take place.

Not all councillors work is quite so significant, but nevertheless the small things matter too. As the darker nights draw in, we are touring Brickhill looking for failed street lights, bollards and road signs. We have already reported quite a few but not nearly as many this year as we used to. Many street lights have now been replaced or upgraded to the new low energy and longer life bulbs and fittings. We are also now using LED lights where possible and the new technology saves money, energy and provides longer life. Please help us and let us know if you see any lights out and we will have them fixed, it could save a life. We have been worried recently by the number of Brickhill residents being bothered by doorstep traders and we have reported some who have been aggressively selling things like roofing repairs. Please tell us if you have been visited as we are compiling evidence for the Borough Council Trading Standards and asking them to take action.

Woodlands Park

In the May 2014 newsletter we asked residents for suggestions on how to spend the £20,117.90 to be handed over to Brickhill Parish Council by Ravensden Parish when Woodlands Park officially becomes part of Brickhill Parish on 1st April 2015.

The aim is to use the money for the benefit of the residents of Woodlands Park, though no doubt the wider Brickhill community will also benefit from this. A wide range of ideas were sent in, many involving improvements in the new North Brickhill Country Park, but other ideas such as noticeboards, more dog bins and signs, a community hall, an outdoor "green gym" and road improvements. Cllr Mark Fitzpatrick, Chair of Brickhill Parish Council said "The ideas suggested would cost many times the money available, but it is worthwhile seeing just what people want and then looking for ways to deliver them".

A group of residents (mostly from Woodlands Park) and parish councillors are now looking into each of the ideas in more detail, to see how they can be taken forward. There will be further consultations with residents before any of this money is spent.

Public Footpath No 24, Brickhill to Clapham - Application to upgrade to legal cycleway dismissed

Eight years after the Cycling Campaign for North Bedfordshire (CCNB) applied to the then Bedfordshire County Council to make the public footpath between Hawk Drive Brickhill and Green Lane Clapham a legal cycleway, it has been dismissed by Bedford Borough Council and subsequently after an appeal also by The Planning Inspectorate.

The route is the remaining part of the old carriageway built for the Clapham Park Estate more than 100 years ago which started in Kimbolton Road (next to the existing Lodge) and went between the two sections of what is now Falcon Avenue, past a further Lodge in Hawk Drive and then to Green Lane in Clapham via Carriage Drive. It is more enjoyable, attractive and safer than using the longer, busy main road alternative and has been used for more than 50 years by cyclists to commute to work and school as well as to the riding school in Green Lane, church services (when the convent was open) and for visiting the North Bedfordshire villages for leisure purposes.

The Borough and The Planning Inspectorate both confirmed there was evidence of the public having used the route with bicycles over a period of more than 50 years but rejected the application on the basis of signage at three specific points of time which they claimed showed a lack of intention on the part of the various landowners over a full period of 20 years to dedicate the way for use by cyclists. These were:

1968 - Little Park Farm end - 'No Entrance, No Horses, Cars, Cycles or Dogs'. No signs of any kind have been seen at this end of the route (even for the footpath) since this time.

1975 - Mid way at the junction of the route to Clapham House - 'Private Land'. This sign was adjacent to the actual route but was taken down immediately in 1975 to avoid confusion with Public Footpath No 24.

1998 - Green Lane end - 'Private Road - Parking Prohibited'.

CCNB would like to thank all residents and others who contributed additional evidence to support the application.


