Election News—At the elections on May 7th, three existing councillors stood down: Andy Wilkins, Ray Waterhouse and Dean Crofts. Councillor Mark Fitzpatrick, chair of Brickhill Parish Council said: "Andy and Ray have served on the Parish Council since it was set up in 2004. Dean joined more recently but made a significant contribution, especially on the Youth Innovation Zone project. I want to thank them all for their contribution to Brickhill and the parish council".

The other nine existing councillors all stood for re-election and were joined by Vince Holloway and Chris Bailes. All 11 were automatically elected as the number of seats to be filled was either the same as the number of candidates (as happened in North Ward) or there were fewer candidates than the number of places for each area. There are therefore 4 vacancies to be filled by co-option. If you are interested in standing, please contact the Clerk if you would like to find out more. Potential candidates should send in a personal statement by 31st May 2015, with the council deciding who to co-opt at its meeting on 4th June. The vacancies are: South & West ward (2), East ward (1), Woodlands Park ward (1).

Woodlands Park Funds— The working group of Woodlands Park residents and parish councillors is continuing to develop suggestions for how the £20,000 transferred from Ravensden Parish Council can be used. The working group wants to hold an event in Woodlands Park on Saturday 23rd May, between 10am and 2pm, to give residents the chance to learn more about some of the suggestions. Residents will be asked to indicate what their preferences are.

News from Park Wood Local Nature Reserve

It has been a busy year on the reserve and anyone who has had a stroll around this north Brickhill site since last July will, I hope, have been impressed by the new carved oak feature bench. It is sited to give a panoramic view over the school fields to the horse paddocks beyond. This, together with the new bridge over the stream was funded by a National Lottery award.



This spring we are beginning to see the rewards of our wild flower planting. Wild daffodils are flowering in the community orchard and the snowdrop display is improving each year. As I write, lesser celandines and primroses are in bloom, soon to be followed by bluebells and wild garlic. In the wild flower mini-meadow below the orchard, yellow rattle has been planted. This is a partial parasite of grass and should, over coming years, help other flowers establish themselves.

The Friends Group spent a couple of mornings in February pruning the apple and pear trees in the orchard area. The orchard contains many varieties that are not easily obtained elsewhere. It is managed for the benefit of human visitors as well as for wildlife. Information boards are now in place and soon a Facebook page will be available for people to find out more about the orchard and the rest of the reserve.

RVS Social Club for over 60s

The Women's Royal Voluntary Service (WRVS) has run a Social Club for over 60s at Brickhill Community Centre in Avon Drive on Tuesdays for many years. The main organiser, Mrs Pat Folkes, has stood down now, with a new team taking over.


