

This year we have a second Beavers group to keep up with demand. This runs on a Tuesday evening, and both groups have approx 15 members. Last term, the Beavers have been participating in activities such as Cookery, Disability Awareness, Hiking, Caving and writing to another Beaver group in Australia. Brickhill and Sustainable Transport

Many Brickhill residents are probably not aware how easy it is to visit the town centre and other locations using sustainable modes of transport such as walking, cycling or public transport. The 2011 census for Brickhill showed that of those who travelled to work 77% drove (approximately 55% less than 5km) while only 7% walked, 5% cycled and 5% took public transport. Brickhill is very fortunate in being close to most of Bedford's facilities. There is therefore tremendous scope for more residents to travel sustainably. Every additional person means one less vehicle on the road causing congestion and parking problems. Cycling and walking, particularly, not only keeps you fit and healthy but can also reduce pollution which contributes to climate change. The town centre can be walked within 30 minutes via Bedford Park from at least half of Brickhill.

Cycling is quicker and allows easy access to any part of the urban area within 15 to 30 minutes using the town's extensive cycle network For those who are not able to walk or cycle, Brickhill has an unrivalled bus service to the town centre. Stagecoach's No 6 (via the railway station in the early morning and in the evening) is the main service while the south east part has No 7 and 10. Woodlands Park is served by Grant Palmer's No 21 during the day with three No 20s going to the railway station in the early morning and returning in the evening. One No 22 each weekday goes onto Sainsbury's Clapham Road. Along Kimbolton Road there is Grant Palmer's No 28 making regular journeys each week day. It is not possible economically to have a direct bus service from Brickhill to all locations that residents may wish to visit but it is very easy to make just one change at the bus station. Why not try one of the modes this summer and you will be pleasantly surprised.




