Anybody visiting Scott Lower School in Brickhill will quickly realise that this is a warm friendly school where the children clearly enjoy learning. The Headteacher, Anita Barker has been at the school for just over a year and her enthusiasm and professionalism have really made an impact, with many positive comments being made about the school. There are now 130 children on roll and visitors comment on how polite and well mannered the children are. The school works really hard to develop its links with the local community. Recently folks from Sir William Harpur House were invited to join the school in celebrating harvest, and they thoroughly enjoyed their afternoon. The school has links with the Park Rangers who run 'Football Fun' club every Tuesday and Thursday. A keen parent helper runs a 'Lego Lunchtime Club.' Local Police Officer PC Hawkey plays an active role in school life and he often joins the 'Walking Bus' on a Wednesday morning. The children at Scott Lower are in a stimulating learning environment and parents and teachers alike were proud when recently the Year 3 and Year 4 children

took part in a general knowledge quiz and Scott Lower took first place.

Lunchtimes and playtimes at Scott Lower School are becoming more exciting with the introduction of the 'Playground Pals Scheme.' Year 4 children go through an application and interview process to be selected. There are 10 Playground Pals trained by Miss Burgess to lead games and activities at lunchtimes and playtimes and look out and care for other children.

There is an effective partnership between parents. children teachers and governors. Scott Lower is a school which Brickhill can be proud of and a place where children can feel secure, wanted, appreciated and ready to learn.

Anjulita Court Care Home

A ceremony took place on Friday 17th October to mark the laying of the foundation stone of Anjulita Court residential care home at North Brickhill, Bedford. The home will include 62 en suite bedrooms, residents' lounge/restaurant. café, activity room hydrotherapy room. A healthy living centre will be available as a drop in facility for local older people. This project is a partnership between The Ibbett Trust and Methodist Homes for the Aged. The facility will provide residential and nursing care - including care for those living with dementia. The completed care home will be named 'Anjulita Court' in tribute to Mr Ibbett's two daughters, Anita and Julia and in Mr Ibbet's own words represents the "tangible results of a dream that will benefit future generations for many years to come". Construction is expected to be complete mid 2009 and the first residents will move in during Autumn 2009.
