

## **BRICKHILL PARISH COUNCIL BUDGET** 2009/10

In 2009/10 the Parish Council will be collecting a total of £52,000 from the Council Taxpayers of Brickhill. This money (known as the Precept) goes to support the Parish Council in its work for the benefit of the local community. This represents a very slight decrease on the Precept collected during 2008-9 which totalled £52,200.

The Parish Council set its detailed budget at a meeting on 5 January 2009 and a copy is available on the website, along with last year's accounts. 
