Brickhill Sustainable Community Plan Progress Report

Following a fantastic response to our community survey (over 29% of households responded) the SCP steering group held a multi-agency workshop at Brickhill Baptist Church on 10 November. This gave members of the community and



service providers a good opportunity to explore the priorities identified by the community in the questionnaires and other data gathering exercises. We were encouraged that so many stakeholders from across the Borough were keen to support us in delivering improvements for Brickhill. We also realised how much the people of Brickhill value our community and physical surroundings.

The steering group is now working hard using all the information we have collected to produce a draft community action plan for Brickhill. This is just the beginning, it is delivery of the action plan which will be the real test of success and this will involve continued commitment from members of the community and statutory bodies. Some of the key areas for action include: adult education, accessibility and rights of way, environmental improvements, health & wellbeing, "liveable streets" and local shops & services. We expect that the Brickhill Sustainable Community Plan will be published in early 2011 and then we can get on with the real work of delivering changes to shape a better future for Brickhill.
