
The Community Orchard was shortlisted in best conservation project.

The Parish Council has been hard at work during 2011, tackling a range of matters. To list just a few of them: taking on responsibility for Waveney Green and Brickhill Community Centre, ongoing concerns about speeding traffic, the (at times) vexed

question of local buses, providing feedback on the proposal for St Thomas More to increase their pupil numbers, the development of the Brickhill Country Park and issues related to the Woodlands Park estate, local policing, the impact of the proposed Tesco store on existing shops, supporting the Brickhill Community Plan, commenting on planning applications that affect Brickhill and much more besides.

# Prepare for rising energy prices

According to the Financial Times, the average dual fuel customer now spends 6% of income on energy bills compared to 3% in 2004. If the trend persists the average household faces fuel poverty by 2015. The trend is upwards, so how do we counter it? Here are some tips.



### 1) Insulate Your Home

Take the frost check. If the frost thaws faster on your roof than your neighbour's, heat is escaping. Top up your loft insulation to 270mm (10.5") to prevent this. Some grants are available to help reduce the cost and it could be free if you are aged 70 or over.

### 2) Go Solar

You can now get Feed in Tariff payments for having solar panels on your roof. These are index linked so they will rise with inflation over 25 years.

### 3) Switch Energy Supplier

With 400 tariffs available, a comparison site can help. If you prefer not to switch, review your payment method - direct debit is cheaper. Ofgem has said it will simplify standard tariffs so like-for-like comparison will get easier.

## **News from Brickhill Local Police Team**

### **News Update From PCSO Roberto Bonforte**

Bedfordshire Police have now launched the new number providing the public with fighting crime, protecting the public a new way to get in touch about **non-emergency issues**. **101** is now the main number to call for incidents such as, stolen cars, if you suspect drug dealing/taking, to give us information about crime in your area and to speak to your Local Policing Team when it is less urgent than 999. In an emergency, always call 999 when you need an immediate response.



So far we are looking to organise various dates and times over the next few months to carry out speed checks in the relevant areas. Posters will be distributed to the relevant areas alerting people about speeding.

### **Operation Nevis**

Operation Nevis was initially introduced in May 2008 to combat anti social behavior and has been proven to be very successful. It involves a team of PCSOs and PCs which will be working together to target hot spot areas to reduce the amount of anti social behavior, low level criminal damage and improve customer satisfaction. Within this operation as a team and from the feedback from the public we have decided to target Brickhill Drive shopping parade, Carron Road Estate and the area behind Test Close. Saying this, all anti social behavior jobs will be attended providing sufficient cover is available so please call in on 101 if you are suffering from anti social behavior in your area.

# **Brickhill Lower School working to** become an eco-school

Eco-schools educate children to live more sustainably by tackling the nine topics of transport, waste, water, litter, school grounds, healthy living, energy, biodiversity, and global perspectives. They cover these topics in lessons and build on the school's existing initiatives in such areas as healthy eating and linking with schools overseas.

Brickhill Lower School has formed an eco-school action team, carried out an environmental review, and tackled the topic of waste. Following the installation of PV solar panels, it is now addressing the topic of energy. Children will monitor the school's energy use, carry out energy saving measures, and decide what energy saving devices the school might install. They will be helped to do this by the Low Carbon Schools Service at Borough Hall.
