The children were kept occupied with a variety of rides and activities including Bungee Trampolines, Inflatable Obstacle Course and Arts and Crafts run by Messy Church. The crowd were entertained with a Magic Show and a Bird of Prey flying display from the Raptor





Foundation. In our marquee visitors were encouraged to join in with the Line Dancing and Belly Dancing demonstrations. The rain held off and a good time was had by all as you can see from our photographs. News from the Parish Council

Following the Diamond Jubilee event on Waveney Green, several residents sent in their comments to the Parish Council office saying how much they liked the event. It is always good to get feedback, so we would encourage residents to do so in future, we want to know what you think!

The Parish Council tries to support the community by making small grants to local groups. This year's grants totalling £1,000 were given to Brickhill Wanderers (£250), bpha (£500) as a contribution to their work with young people in Brickhill, Open House(£200) and £50 to the Bobby scheme run by the Police, which aims to make the homes of elderly and vulnerable residents more secure. The Parish Council looks after Waveney Green and wants it to be a great place for walking and recreation. We employ a litter picker and for the summer months have increased the number of hours worked. In July further repairs were carried out on a large stretch of the footpath on the Green at a cost of just over £4000 as part of our 3 year plan for Waveney Green.

At the Parish Council's meeting in June a new councillor was co-opted, Ann Reeve. Ann lives in Orwell Close and has lived in Brickhill for over 36 years. She has 2 daughters, 4 grandchildren and a father who all live locally. Anne is employed as a Health Care Assistant working for the District Nursing Team.

Finally, could you be a Junior Street Champion? These are young people who want to help look after their street or local area. You can help can clean up litter, clean up graffiti and report environmental issues in your street. All Junior Street Champions get a free high visibility vest, cap and bag as part of their starter pack. Champions can earn pin badges to attach to your cap, your vest or even your bag. Bedford Community Safety Partnership Multi Agency Day of Action

Residents on the Carron Road Estate, Brickhill, benefited from a successful multi-agency Day of Action on Tuesday 12th of June. Bedfordshire Fire and Rescue Service, Bedfordshire Police, Places for People, BPHA, Neighbourhood Watch, Bedford Borough Council, Brickhill Parish Council and Anglian Water all worked together to actively engage with residents on community safety matters.

A mobile Police Station in the Carron Road car park provided a hub for the day, and local residents called in for advice from all the agencies involved. Teams from the agencies also visited the homes of local residents to seek their views on the local area and to identify ways that the agencies can work together to improve Brickhill. Lots of local services were promoted, such as property marking and Home Fire Safety Checks. Community Speed Watch also deployed a Speed Indication Devise (SID) in Brickhill during the day where details of speeding vehicles travelling over 35mph in the 30mph speed limit areas were passed to police for further action.

SCOTT LOWER SCHOOL RECEIVES INCLUSION QUALITY MARK AWARD

In May 2012 Scott Lower School was inspected as part of the selection process for the Inclusion Mark Award. The assessor spent the day speaking with pupils, staff, parents and governors. Are you a young person (aged 13-19) interested in joining a youth working group?

Could you help the Parish Council to bid successfully to ensure Brickhill becomes one of the pilot projects in Bedford Borough.

The Bedford borough project will award 9 areas across Bedford funds a total of £3,000 for groups of young people and adults to find out what goes on in their area, see what is missing for young people then use the money to try out different things. It might be that they want to use the money for trips to MK, or to run a youth project every month, or to put on a week of holiday activities...... the choice is up to the young people in the community. The Borough will help out with training, support and ideas. We need at least 6 young people aged 13-19 to take part in the project between now and March 2013. You should be willing to come to a project meeting every month where you will get training, meet the other projects, share ideas and let everyone know what is happening in your area. Park Wood Local Nature Reserve

Over 20 species of butterfly have been recorded on the reserve. Ones seen so far this year include Brimstone, Orange Tip, Speckled Wood, Comma, Meadow Brown, Marbled White and Red Admiral. In the summer of 2009 the reserve was awash with migratory Painted Ladies, as was much of the UK. I wonder if any will appear this summer!

Around the reserve there are a range of bird and bat boxes. Those designed for Blue and Great Tits are the most popular. The biggest broods this year were nine for Blue Tit and seven for Great Tit. No luck yet in attracting Tawny Owls to either of their nest boxes. They are around, so perhaps 2013 will be the year.

Many wildflowers can be enjoyed around the reserve. Of particular interest are the orchids. Over 2000 flower spikes of 'Common Spotted' were counted this June, but also present are a few Pyramidial and Bee Orchids. The number of orchids were well down this year (previous high was just under 6000). Perhaps the long dry spell has had an impact!

A small group of volunteers assist the council in the management of the reserve. Each year we carry out litter picks, grass cutting and raking, scrub clearance, path and pond maintenance etc. The next planned session is grass raking of the wildflower area in September provisional dates are Saturday 15th and the 22nd. Beauchamp Middle School

Beauchamp School Handball team recently played in the English National School Finals. Beauchamp won every game, conceding just 1 goal—Director of Specialism Mr Thompson said "This was excellent preparation for our trip to Sweden, to get to the National Finals in our first year of entering was a superb achievement for the boys."

The squad then travelled to Gothenburg, Sweden to participate in the Junior Handball Championships. 20,200 players took part, spanning 41 different nations. Beauchamp were also selected to represent England in the opening ceremony in front of 17,000 people. Director of Specialism Mr Thompson said "The opening ceremony was amazing, the crowd were electric and the boys were very proud to represent England. We were the only school team participating-it is a regional and international tournament, so a huge step up for the boys. The level of handball on display was the best in the world and the squad have learnt a great deal from this. The team will continue to train and will hope to compete again. The other nations were surprised to see a team from England participating in Handball and we were warmly welcomed by all."

Beauchamp School are working closely with England Handball to continue the community handball club for children in Bedford and its surrounding area.



Since the official launch in May, the Brickhill Good Neighbours Scheme has got off to a steady start. With a willing band of a dozen CRB checked volunteers we have offered a variety of services such as befriending, lifts to appointments and even changing light bulbs!



Community Speedwatch


A regular problem highlighted by our Community Safety Forum is excessive speed along our roads. In response, local people have been trained in the use of traffic speed monitoring equipment and will shortly be using this on the roads in Brickhill.

Community Speed Watch is manned by volunteers who are trying to keep our roads safe for us all. Its use is signposted and the operators wear high visibility jackets in order to be seen. The objective is to reduce traffic speed not prosecute offends. Anyone caught speeding is recorded and details sent to the police, and then receive a warning letter from them. Persistent offenders face prosecution.

Update from Borough Councillors

Many of the requests which we receive from residents involve speeding and parking issues. We are currently working to introduce parking restrictions around Kestrel Road, Hawk Drive and Tyne Crescent which will also have a 20mph speed restriction. An extension of the noverge parking scheme currently in operation in Linnet Way has also been requested by

residents at the Community Safety Forum meetings and is supported by Brickhill Parish Council. If the majority of residents are in favour then we will support the proposal.

The areas affected would include Falcon Avenue (both sides), Kestrel Road, Curlew Crescent, Plover Way, Brickhill Drive, Starling Way, Swift Close, Linnet Way (already covered).
