News from the Chair: Councillor Mark Fitzpatrick

Thank you to the residents who came to the Annual Parish Meeting on 24th June. There was some really useful information given by Jo Maule of Goldington Family Centre about their work; they provide Children's Centre services and activities across the north of Bedford, including Brickhill Parish and the Woodlands Park estate. Ed Burnett of the Borough talked about plans for Parkwood Nature Reserve and the Community Orchard; it was good news to hear of their successful bid for lottery funding to enable more improvements to be made. Simon Fisher, also from Bedford Borough, gave an update on the North Brickhill Country Park; parts of the park are to be taken over from the developer shortly. Also the new football pitches are due to be used for the forthcoming season whilst some of the Woodlands Park estate infrastructure has been adopted by the council.

With this newsletter you should receive an additional leaflet from Bedford Borough Council as part of the Community Governance Review. The initial consultation period is extended until 15th September. Of the responses received so far there is overwhelming support (91%) for Woodlands Park to be moved out of Ravensden Parish. There is little support (2%) for Woodlands Park to be deparished. The choice is therefore between Woodlands Park becoming officially part of Brickhill Parish or having a new Parish Council covering just Woodlands Park. In Brickhill Parish there is strong support for Woodlands Park to become part of Brickhill, with 82% of Brickhill residents who replied supporting this. In Woodlands Park itself views are currently fairly evenly divided. Most residents have not yet stated their views. Please take time to do so – it will only take a minute and it is important for your views to be counted. Go to www.forms.bedford.gov.uk/brickhill/ to send in your views.

Good News from Beauchamp Middle School

On the 5th and 6th of June 2013, Beauchamp Middle School received an inspection visit from OFSTED. We are delighted that the OFSTED judgements recognised our achievements over the last two academic years. The overall effectiveness of the school is now 'good'.

The inspection team judged the school in four areas; achievement of pupils, quality of teaching, leadership and management and the behaviour and safety of pupils. We were judged 'good' in all aspects.

Here are some comments from the Ofsted Inspection team:

Achievement of pupils

The attainment of pupils has risen since the last inspection and continues to rise. All students are set challenging targets in each subject they study and their progress against such targets is regularly and carefully assessed.

The quality of teaching and learning

The school uses a good range of strategies to improve and develop teaching, based firmly on sharing good practice. This has resulted in consistently good practice across the school. Learning tasks are active, interesting and relevant to the pupils. Marking is regular and commonly provides clear advice on the next steps in learning, which encourages students to respond and improve their own work.

The behaviour and safety of pupils

Pupils are typically considerate, polite and cooperative. Expectations for good behaviour are high. Pupils say they feel very safe in school. Incidents of bullying are now rare and pupils have faith in their teachers to help them when problems arise.

The quality of leadership and management

The Head Teacher provides strong leadership. He is ambitious for the school and wants it to develop even further. The senior leadership team supports the Head Teacher well and works closely with him to drive improvement. Monitoring and evaluation are highly effective in the early identification of strengths and weaknesses which lead to clearly defined actions for further improvement.

First the good news with continued progress for growth and regeneration across Bedford Borough. Mayor Dave Hodgson has just opened a £6 million refurbishment of the Higgins, town centre cinema is coming back as part of a major town centre redevelopment and major retailers such as



Morrisons, Waitrose and B & Q are investing here with new stores. After years of waiting Bedford will get a bus station it deserves as we are investing over 8 million pounds in a completely new bus station, public toilets and major refurbishment of All Hallows car park. A brand new surface car park is already being built in Greyfriars. Thousands of new jobs have been created as a result of the growth in Bedford over the past three years and Bedford has a bright future. There is success also for our schools and congratulations are due to Beauchamp Middle, another of our Borough Schools showing great improvement. No wonder Ofsted says Bedford Borough is the best place in the region to send your child to primary or lower school. We will continue to work to support the Mayor in making Bedford a great place to live and work. We should all be proud of Bedford.

Sadly there is worrying news as Bedford Borough Conservatives have called for more gypsy sites to be opened by the Council, they include locations at Hawk Drive and Manton Lane in Brickhill. Most worrying was the claim made at Borough Executive by the conservatives that 3.4 acres of land at Little Park Farm, off Hawk Drive was an 'ideal' location for a gyspy site. Mayor Dave Hodgson has joined with us in fighting off development proposals at locations such as Mowsbury Golf Course and Jackman's Farm. In addition he has enabled Waveney Green to be transferred to Brickhill Parish Council so that local people can protect this valuable green space for future generations. Our position on the land at Little Park Farm, Hawk Drive is clear, we believe that the Borough Council should sell the land with a legally enforceable restrictive covenant which prevents it from ever being used as a gyspy and traveller site. As your local councillors we believe that the most pressing need now is not more gypsy sites but rather to continue our progress with preventative measures at parks and open spaces across the borough to prevent unlawful encampments as part of a comprehensive approach.
