

Woodlands Park recommended to join Brickhill Parish

The Borough has been consulting residents on the future parish council arrangements for Brickhill and Ravensden, which currently includes the Woodlands Park estate off Tyne Crescent. At the end of the most recent phase of the consultation the preferred option in the existing Brickhill Parish, in Woodlands Park and in the remainder of Ravensden Parish is for the Woodlands Park estate to join Brickhill Parish. The Borough is now to consult on this recommendation. Please do take time to state your views in this final part of the consultation. If the change is agreed, it takes effect from 2015. Brickhill Parish Council has consistently taken the view that it makes sense for Woodlands Park to join Brickhill. If you have previously taken part in the consultations – thank you – but please do so one more time when you receive a letter from the Borough Council. Meanwhile if you have any queries about this proposal do speak to one of your parish councillors or contact the Clerk.

Success at Scott

Staff, children, parents and governors at Scott Lower School have been celebrating the fantastic outcome of its Ofsted Inspection. The school was awarded a "Good" grading. Inspectors were impressed with the quality of teaching and learning across the whole school, and also with the behaviour of the children. They noted, "Pupils are polite and welcoming both in class and around the school. They respond very well to the school's positive approach to behaviour and grow as confident learners...This contributes well to a calm and safe environment where pupils flourish."



The Ofsted team were extremely complimentary about the children's reading skills across the whole school, commenting that, "Pupils read fluently and confidently from a wide range of books and are keen to discuss their favourite characters, making reference to the texts". The school is also facing an exciting time, as it is increasing in size, to gradually become a two form entry school with a new school building planned for spring 2014.

Best Energy Deal Workshop Tuesday 3rd December 2pm St Mark's Church Community Centre in the Wren Room

Are you worried about escalating fuel price costs and how you can cope? Do you need help working out where to find the best deal and how to go about this?

The Bedford Citizen Advice Bureau is currently offering Best Energy Deal workshops across the community. The purpose of the sessions are to help people reduce their energy costs by ensuring they choose the best supplier for their needs, are in receipt of all eligible grants and discounts and manage their consumption.

Brickhill Lower School Club (BLSFC)

With the support of the local community, BLSFC continues to go from strength to strength both on and off the pitch. The club has recently achieved sponsorship from the RMT Union, Autoglass and Advancing Property; funding that has helped the club secure new equipment and kits (pictured) for the record number of children that have signed up to the club.

The club is working with Bedford University to provide mentoring for students who have achieved, or are working towards, FA level 1 and 2 Coaching Certification. FACT'S (Football and Coaches to Share) is a program designed to help Lower Schools set up and run their own football clubs with support from Brickhill's team of coaches. By using the tried and tested club model that Brickhill have devised they are working to get as many Bedford schools as possible to provide FA approved coaching sessions in a safe and fun environment.

FACT'S is also heavily centred on the wellbeing and enjoyment of its players and parents/carers from all of the clubs affiliated to the program. The club promotes good behaviours amongst its young players but also promotes good relations between coaches and adults from all clubs which has had a very positive effect on the children's match day experience. In recent matches between Brickhill Lower School and Castle Lower School, parents and carers provided cakes and bacon rolls for each other giving theses match days a real sense of occasion and a fun and friendly atmosphere for all those involved.

All of this work is undertaken by volunteers who are FA qualified coaches but the club receives no funding other than the £10 per term subscription from its players, keeping the club affordable and accessible to the local community.

Friends of Park Wood Local Nature Reserve get Big Lottery Fund grant

The planned improvements will be carried out over the coming year. Information boards and sign posts will be installed and two more benches provided for weary walkers and those just wishing to sit and enjoy nature. A new bridge will be erected over the stream and the path surfaces at the kissing gates improved so as to avoid the flooding which is currently a problem. These are exciting times to live in Bedford with so many things now changing for the better. We have great schools, in the last year 18 out of the 19 Local Authority maintained schools inspected by Ofsted were judged to be either good or outstanding. Schools in Bedford Borough were ranked as 11th out of 150 local authorities across the country and number one in the Eastern region. Economically also our town is thriving attracting new businesses and providing new apprenticeships and jobs. We have seen the new Waitrose, the B&Q store and with Morrisons even the petrol prices have fallen! In the town centre there are now more public toilets than ever before and the Bus Station toilets will open next week after being completely rebuilt. Even the bus station will be rebuilt next year as a part of the 8 million regeneration investment. From Saturday 23 November the first two hours of parking will be free every Saturday all year round in council owned car parks. In spite of already having to make savings of over £40 million from government, we have prioritised frontline services so that things like libraries. sports centres, road repairs, grass cutting and weekly bin collections have been protected. All this has been done whilst freezing council tax! Soon we will see the results of more funding which we have attracted to Bedford with 6 million spent on the Black Cat and millions of private investment to bring a riverside town centre development on the site of the old Town Hall with new restaurants, a cinema and even a micro brewery. In these really tough times when other councils are cutting services and increasing council tax we can be proud that we live in Bedford a town which is bucking the trend and has a very bright future.

20mph Speed Limits in Brickhill

Speeding is one of the main concerns of Borough residents including those in Brickhill when asked what would increase their quality of life. This is particularly the case for vulnerable people - the elderly, less agile, those with poor sight and hearing, families with young children and school children on their own - who find it increasingly difficult to cross roads easily and safely as well as for cyclists riding along the roads.

Numerous organisations within the UK have been campaigning for many years for 20mph to become the default speed limit, not only around schools but for all residential areas and town centres. This is common practice in many countries around the world and has saved thousands of lives and serious injuries. Although government has not made this mandatory to date they have been progressively making it easier for local authorities to introduce area wide 20mph limits and zones. This has been taken on board by many towns and cities. Bedford Borough has an action plan but only a few small areas have been converted to date.

In August 2013 Tyne Crescent and adjacent roads were converted to a 20mph zone and also around Brickhill and Scott Lower Schools during arrival and departure times. Although 20mph speed limits are not policed anymore than other speeds compliance will slowly occur as attitudes change. For motorists, lower speeds mean reduced fuel consumption and less harmful emissions while at the same time reducing congestion. Journey times are increased generally by only a few seconds. This is a small sacrifice to make to avoid the suffering and grief caused to families and friends as well as the driver by a fatal accident. The average cost benefit of preventing just one death has been estimated by the Department for Transport to be £1.9m (2011 values).

Residents of Curlew Crescent, by a substantial majority of those who responded to a recent survey, have recently requested a 20mph speed limit. Realistically not just one road but a wider area (bounded by Brickhill Drive, Linnet Way, Waveney Avenue and Avon Drive) should be changed at the same time and this request has been passed onto the Borough.

Are you out of work and looking for a job?

One of the themes of the Brickhill Sustainable Community Plan is to achieve 'a Thriving Brickhill' – with a focus on economic development, regeneration and enterprise. Relatively few jobs are provided in Brickhill: just under 1 for every 3 people of working age. This means that over 80% of working residents commute outside the parish, mainly within Bedford (60%) but also to the rest of Bedfordshire, Milton Keynes or elsewhere. The number of Brickhill residents out of work and looking for a job is lower than many other parts of Bedford Borough with 158 residents claiming Jobseeker's Allowance in February 2013.

During the Community Plan consultation, residents told us that there is a demand for local job search support, involving local agencies in partnership. working together councillors are in discussion with local agencies, but we want to hear from you. If you are currently out of work, or have been out of work recently, what sort of support would help you locally? Do you have access to a PC and the internet to help look for and apply for jobs? News from the Brickhill Good Neighbour Team

The Brickhill Good Neighbours Scheme has been running for 18 months now, helping local residents with transport to health appointments and local amenities, setting up new technology in the home and befriending those who benefit from some extra support. 
