Future Liabilities

- **1. Elections** the Parish Council is liable for election costs estimated at between £5,000 and £7,500 in respect of a by-election held in May 2006. Further by-elections costs may arise at any time. Additional election costs will certainly be incurred in May 2008 when the whole council will be elegible for re-election, costs are estimated at between £5,000 and £7,500.
- **2.Staff Gratuity** a sum of £1,766 is currently ring fenced in the reserves in case payment of the Clerk's gratuity (in lieu of pension arrangements) becomes payable.
- **3. Allotments** a sum of £700 is held in reserves to allow refund of key deposits held by allotment tenants. The allotment site will require re-fencing at some point in the foreseeable future, current estimates for re-fencing the whole site are in the region of £50,000 £60,000.
