	Cllr C Royden reported that a copy of the report by the Brickhill Borough Councillors had been circulated and the Clerk had put a copy on the website.				
	Borough Cllr Martin-Moran-Bryant reported that the height barrier at the entrance to the changing rooms off Ashmead Road remains on the ground and she is chasing the Borough Council to get this reinstated as soon as possible.				
	Cllr Blakeman said he was pleased to see that the bus station was undergoing a deep clean. Cllr C Royden said that the Borough were not satisfied with what had been done and a further deep clean was to take place.				
	Cllr Blakeman was disappointed that Stagecoach/Bedford Borough Council had not updated the timetables covering Brickhill nor the electronic indicators. Cllr Royden said he will raise this with Stagecoach.	Cllr C Royden			
7.	To receive any update following the East West Rail meeting held on 2 nd March 2022:				

ltem	Description	Action
	Cllr Barlow had attended the meeting and had circulated a detailed written report to his fellow parish councillors.	
	It was his view that the meeting was disappointing in general mainly because EWR still had not provided information on their environmental, carbon or cost calculations from the 2021 consultation. EWR continue to appear to evade the important questions and refuse to meet the public directly.	
	Topics were discussed for future meetings with a number of questions and topics being requested including evidence of how EWR had quantified that Route E was the least environmentally damaging and the route with least carbon impact and that EWR be transparent about the increase in costs from the 2021 consultation stage.	
	Cllr Barlow was thanked for his report.	
8.	To receive an update on the Brickhill Neighbourhood Development Plan:	
	Cllr Fitzpatrick reported that a small group had met over the last few months including Cllrs Blakeman, Grant and Green plus one resident.	
	It was hoped to produce a draft planning policy document in April. There is currently no housing requirement by Bedford Borough Council within Brickhill. But should any development take place, it would need to reflect those policies contained in the NDP.	
	The focus of the policies in the NDP is likely to be on the open spaces within the parish. North Brickhill Country Park and Waveney Green are already designated. Three further areas have been identified: the pond on Brickhill Drive, the green area adjacent to the scout hut and the strip on Falcon Avenue.	
	It was noted that the North Brickhill Country Park does not include the area on Woodlands with the two ponds nor the meadow north of Crispin Drive and Egremont Mews nor the area on Ashmead Road which has been recently planted with trees.	
	The NDP group is suggesting to the parish council that these areas are incorporated in the North Brickhill Country Park as part of the Local Plan 2040.	

Item	Description	Action
	The aim of the NDP will be to ensure environmentally friendly development with a focus also on protecting the local heritage and preserving the shops.	
	The group is working with the consultant, David Chetwyn to produce the draft planning policy document. At this stage it is not clear what is happening regarding NDP funding until the grant scheme opens up again.	
9.	To identify any county wide issues to be raised through the Bedfordshire Association of Town and Parish Council County Committee:	
	Cllr Grant said that he represents Brickhill Parish Council on this committee. He asked if parish councillors could identify any county wide issues which could be brought to the attention of this committee.	
	Suggestions at the meeting included flood risk and river defences, the building on green as opposed to brown field sites, EWR and air traffic changes. Indeed, environmental issues in general.	
	Parish Councillors to contact Cllr Grant directly with any further issues.
