	Cllr Fitzpatrick circulated information to parish councillors. The remaining monies have now been returned to Groundwork UK (see Bacs 34 below for £1,075). Cllr Fitzpatrick is hoping to get further monies from Groundwork UK which would enable the NDP to be finished if possible in the Autumn. He wants to try to do this ahead of the new Local Plan being officially adopted.	
7.	To receive reports from the Borough Councillors:	
	Borough Cllr Rider said that Bedford Borough Council has just won a Government "Bees Knees Champion Award" recognising the bugs and bees project on Brickhill Drive. She and Borough Cllr Charles Royden were expecting the fountain to be working again on Rooksmead by now and are chasing to get this done as soon as possible. Applications are being made for more bottle banks and parish councillors were asked to let Borough Cllr Rider know any possible locations. She was aware of the car park/changing rooms off Ashmead Drive as a possible location. Brickhill Borough Councillors had supported residents opposed to a licence being granted to a street trader which would have been able to operate late at night. It has since been withdrawn. An application has gone in for pavement repairs for parts of Tyne Crescent. Borough Cllr Rider was willing to answer any questions. She was thanked for her report.

9.	To agree to the installation of a memorial bench on Waveney Green:	Clerk
	The Clerk reported that a request had been made by a family of a teacher from Brickhill Middle School for a bench in her memory. The Clerk had met with the family and a location had been agreed. The bench would be in recycled plastic with a plaque embedded in it. The Parish Council agreed to its installation. The Clerk would inform the family and arrange to meet with the Borough Council officer to agree the location along with the additional bench towards Falcon Avenue already agreed.	
10.	To receive a report on the Bedford New Deal:	
	Cllr Fitzpatrick said that in 2019 the Government invited 101 towns to apply for up to £25m each. Bedford was on that list and invited to create a town investment plan. The monies had to be spent on urban regeneration, planning and land use and skills and infrastructure and connectivity. A map of Bedford Town was produced which includes Brickhill parish excluding Woodlands Park. A Town Deal Board was created whose responsibility was to agree proposals and provide oversight and support for that. A company called Acom was appointed to provide consultancy support. The Town Deal Board contains a wide range of individuals. Cllr Fitzpatrick as Chairman of Brickhill Parish Council is also involved. Bedford Town submitted a bid and got £22.6m. Midland Road re-development is included in the plan and generally the majority of the funding is to be spent elsewhere around the town centre. Included in the plan is cycling which will probably benefit Brickhill. Cllr Fitzpatrick was thanked for his report.
