Anglian Water

We continue to be less than impressed by the standard of service given by Anglian Water since we highlighted the blocked sewers which flooded across Brickhill. We have met with their senior management and expressed concerns shared with us by residents of poor service. This work on Avon Drive was completed to fix a leak but equipment was left behind by the contractor without properly completing the job.

Sweeping Pavements

We have asked the council to sweep areas of pavement where leaves have remained over winter including this area in Torridge Rise. They have now carried out the cleaning work and we would welcome residents advising us if they have any further causes of concern.

BPHA Rents to rise

We have written to BPHA to express our concerns at the announcement of high rent increases. Obviously we are at a time of great worry for families who are struggling in a cost of living crisis. Many of our residents are facing difficulty feeding their families and trying to keep them warm. It is therefore a hammer blow to receive an increase of 7% on top of what is already the largest monthly payment they have to make. Undoubtedly this will place a severe financial burden on some of those least able to afford it in our community. We have pointed out that BPHA has a core operating margin comfortably above 40% and the underlying surplus from operations after interest costs was £15.7m (September 2021: £18.2m). We have asked BPHA to reconsider this and offer a lower increase at this time of national emergency.

Sadly we have had a disappointing response from BPHA who have said that they are going ahead with the increase. They have advised us that they are extremely aware that customers face huge financial challenges at this time and they have a team of people available to offer help. They advise their customers to click the 'Refer to Money Advice' button on the website (bpha.org.uk) where there is advice and contact details to talk to someone confidentially. They have stated that If people talk and engage, they will do everything they can to help and work with people who are struggling.





Tree Planting Thanks to those residents who have contacted us to request tree planting in verges outside their homes. The are all being assessed by the council and will be planted where possible, avoiding utilities etc. We will respond directly to residents when we have confirmation

Putnoe Surgery We have not been encouraged by some of the latest meetings around GP health services for Bedford. We thanks residents who supported our campaign to which saved Putnoe Walk-In-Centre, we are watching carefully to ensure that it is future protected.
