Brickhill Neighbourhood Plan progress

Protecting Brickhill's green open spaces—and more

At the meeting of Brickhill Parish Council on 6th March, it was agreed to officially submit the Neighbourhood Plan to the Borough Council. This follows the public consultation that took place in April/May 2024, after which all comments received from members of the public and other organisations were considered, with changes made to the Neighbourhood Plan as appropriate. Thank you to everyone who sent in their views.

The fundamental aims of the Neighbourhood Plan remain to protect more green open spaces in Brickhill, by designating seven additional areas as Local Green Space—the equivalent of designation as greenbelt land. There are other policies that seek to protect Brickhilll's heritage and encourage sustainable design, transport and movement.

The revised Neighbourhood Plan is available on the Brickhill Parish Council website, www.brickhillparishcouncil.gov.uk, along with supporting documents. One of the documents is the Consultation Statement which shows all the comments received and the responses to those comments.



What happens next

The Borough Council will check that the submitted plan complies with all relevant legislation. If it does, then they will publicise the draft for a minimum of six weeks and invite representations. The Borough Council will publicise details about when and how to make representations; they will also appoint an independent examiner.

The next stages after that will be:

- Submission of the draft plan for independent examination.
- Publication of the independent examiner's report and decisions.
- A referendum of residents of the draft plan and
- If the referendum result supports the draft plan, the bringing of the plan into force.

East West Rail

Brickhill Parish Council replied to the recent consultations by East West Rail, focusing on the impact of the railway on local rights of way between Brickhill, Clapham, Thurleigh and Ravensden. The parish also wrote to the Planning Inspectorate's consultation of EWR's Environmental Statement, focusing again on public rights of way but also on mitigation generally. Serving as a councillor in opposition is very different from being a part of the administration. The Mayor and his Executive have enormous powers and our duty is to work hard to get the best for Brickhill residents. A recent example was the cut to our school crossing patrol at Scott Primary which was closed with less than 24hrs notice on the last day of the Christmas term. There was

We will continue to campaign for our local community and the services which make Brickhill a great place to live. It is unacceptable that we have seen a stop to our road resurfacing in Brickhill, especially when some roads and pavements are so badly in need of attention. When Woodlands Park came into our Brickhill Ward we made it a priority to have all the public areas adopted from the developers. We are pleased that we are making real progress with this and Grenadier Close is now close to completion. Residents have contacted us concerned that previous plans by the council to sell land off for development on Ashmead Road, Mowsbury Golf Course and Freemans Common might now once more be brought forward. We have asked the Mayor to disclose the list of sites he is considering and he has refused to do so. As soon as we know more we will make residents aware and we will robustly campaign against further development of these sites.

De Parys Ward Borough Councillors Update March 2025 From Henry Vann and David Sawyer

The area of Brickhill Parish that falls within De Parys Ward is best summarised as Brickhill Drive, Robin Hill, Rooksmead, Mallard Hill, Eagle Gardens and Goldcrest Way.

In 2024/25 we have continued with our push for improvements to the environment of our local area has included supporting Christmas lights at the Brickhill Drive shops and pushing hard to get the paving



repaired at this location. This year our ward fund has also supported the installation of a new bench on Mallard Hill near Robin Hill as well as more bulb planting in the Robin Hill / Mallard Hill area. On the Council we have backed Charlie and Wendy's petition for the reinstatement of the school crossing patrol at Scott Primary that was removed with no consultation. We have also reported potholes along Brickhill Drive and noticed the council have unilaterally removed benches in Bedford Park and are reducing the flowerbeds as well. We are also concerned by proposed cuts to street cleansing, library services, streetlights and telecare services as well as ongoing borrowing costs. For the first time in recent years the Council's own finance officer has had to highlight the risks to the council's financial stability.
